The White House was burned by the British, August 24, 1814. The territorial government was drafted Alaska, August 26, 1912. Imprisonment for debt was abolished in England, August 25, 1862. A peace treaty between U.S. and Germany was signed in Berlin, August 10, 1921. Edison demonstrated first phonograph, August 28, 1877. The 19th Amendment, allowing women suffrage, became effective, August 26, 1920. The Spanish landed in St. Augustine, Florida, August 27, 1565. August 7 was birthdate of Confucius, Chinese philosopher (551 B.C.). Thomas Jefferson (1823); Samuel Goldwyn (1884); and Lloyd C. Douglas (1877). The first petroleum well was opened at Titusville, Fla., by Edward L. Drake, August 29, 1859. The first International Air Races were held in Berlin, France, August 25, 1900. U.S. occupation troops landed in Japan, August 26, 1945. An Indian reservation was established in New Jersey, August 29, 1762. The second Battle of Massachusetts began August 29, 1662.
