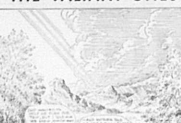
### The Falls Of The Ohio

Shell instructor Billy Reynolds offers 10 clues that may help you spot trouble before it starts

1. **Many brakes.** When you are standing still, push the brake pedal down with a firm, steady pressure. If the car sinks to the floor, you've got trouble that should be fixed right now.
2. **Wandering wheels.** If your front tires show more wear on one side of the tread than the other, your wheel alignment is probably a little off. One of the ways you can increase tire wear up to 50 percent.
3. **Tightly front end.** Show down hard on either bumper with your foot. If the car lugs up and down for a long time before coming to a rest, all you Shell dealer has to check your shock absorbers.
4. **Decepted tail pipe.** If your muffler or tail pipe is rusted through in spots, it's a good idea to replace it.
5. **"Boated" radiator hoses.** Inpect all of the rubber hoses that run across your engine compartment. If they are weak and swollen, they may be full of air and cause your engine to overheat.
6. **Marred windshield.** If your windshield has a crack or chip, it's probably due to a loose windshield wiper. Have your Shell dealer check out this condition.
7. **Strange noises.** If you hear any odd noises from your car, they can be warning signs of trouble on the way.
8. **Under the hood checks.** You can learn a lot by looking at your engine. Watch for oil, fuel and water leaks. Also, look for any loose connections.
9. **Squeaky belts.** If your engine runs uneven, check the belts used when you start up a work hour, it's probably the trouble. But it could be something else. Check it out.
10. **Oil-streaked sidewalks.** Check the sides of your tires when you slow down - the sides being in. Look for signs of leaking fuel on the ground. Could be a leaking fuel valve, or faulty oil seals on the rear wheels. Both can be serious.

Any trained Shell dealer knows many more signs of trouble. Take advantage of his training. And one last tip: when you've got your car in top condition, it's a lot more fun to drive.
