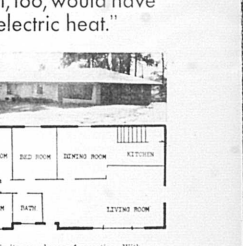
VISITORS FROM THE DISTRICT
