very anxious. When we consider how often hand saws are used, it stands to reason that there are simply more chances of getting an injury through their use.

Handtools increase or divert the power in our hands and they can do that job better and safer than they are in good condition. For instance, cutting tools such as knives, axes, and chisels should be kept sharp at all times—they are safer that way. Wooden handles on hammers, shovels, and files should fit tight, and power cords on electric handtools. It pays to check the power cords on electric handtools, and those exposing the insulation should be shortened or replaced.

These are some of the things you can check on, but half of the job of keeping these handy assistants in good condition is having a definite place to store them properly. The next time you take a safety in spetsen, take a special look at the condition of all handtools and how they are stored. Make what repairs you can necessary and get each tool ready for its next use.

Young employees may need some tips on the proper use and care of handtools, but all employees can be especially helpful by calling attention to the tools needing repair or replacement.

It's a simple fact—handtools in good condition and used properly, do the job faster and safer.

The number one problem of American women today is lack of time. A recent USDA survey showed that almost 60 percent of the states, thought their biggest time-front problem was lack of time. A similar survey was made by the American Home Economics Association and the General Federation of Women's Clubs. By a ratio of two to one, women surveyed placed good management of time at the top of the list of suggested attributes of successful homemakers.

The homemaker who holds another job outside the home often has a lot of trouble with time manage-

ment. Since the working wife and mother seems to be here to stay... a program directed especially to their problems in home management was presented on November 5, at the National Housing Center in Washington, D. C., by the American Home Economics Association. The program was called "Home Shortcuts for the Working Woman."

One of the speakers was Ruth Orvedal, executive head of the family life and management department, University of Maryland.

She stressed that tips and methods of organizing home management are useless if they conflict with the way of life you and your family feel is best for you. Family cooperation is essential she emphasized. A person with two jobs must accept the fact that her home cannot be managed in the same way it would be if that were her only job. Yet... she pointed out... pull feelings are common in women who work outside the home because they feel they must equal... and sometimes excel... the accomplishments of the full-time homemaker.

Sheep, beef and dairy can also use these pastures when weather conditions are favorable.
