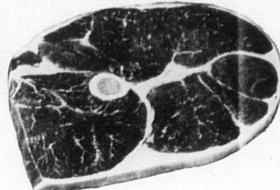

Wheat diversion deadline

December 14 is the last day for signing farms under the 1963 wheat stabilization program. Under this voluntary wheat reduction program, farmers may divert from 20 to 50 percent of their wheat allotment or base acreage, with special diversion provisions for small farms. The diverted acreage must be devoted to an approved conservation use.
Farmers are cautioned, however, to sign up for only the amount of acreage they intend to divert from 1963 production. Failure to divert the full amount of acreage signed up would result in loss of diversion and price-support payments, as well as loss of eligibility for the regular wheat price-support loan or purchase agreement.
Farmers who participate in the 1963 program will be eligible to receive special payments for voluntarily diverting a part of their allotment or base acreage from the production of wheat and devoting that acreage to a conservation use, and they will also qualify for extra price-support payments and for the regular price-support loan or purchase agreement.
