Crop insurance office now open

Federal Crop Insurance Corporation — an agency of the United States Department of Agriculture — has opened a local service office at 12 East Eighth street in Paris, F.C.I.C. District Director, John Soper, announced this week. Called the Bourbon District Office, it will maintain and process records for Crop Insurance policy holders in Bourbon, Bath, Clark, Harrison, Montgomery, and Nicholas Counties.

Priority to the new district office, Crop Insurance records were handled by local service agents on a part time basis. Now, Mrs. Evelyn F. Dalby of Paris, will work full time operation of the office. "Service center." In addition, the office will record acreage reports, handle loss notices, and act as a source of accurate Crop Insurance information for the six county area. The new office, explained Director Soper, will increase efficiency of the Corporation in the area, and provide faster service for insured barley growers.

Federal Crop Insurance operates a voluntary non-profit farm insurance program for barley growers. With Crop Insurance protection, a farmer is guaranteed the return of his cost of growing tobacco should any natural hazard such as drought, excessive moisture, flood, or fire destroy all or part of his crop.
