Nicholas County public assistance

Nicholas County's public assistance recipients received \$15,145 in aid last month through the State Department of Economic Security. The needy aged received a total of \$10,743 in September, families receiving \$2,620, the blind and permanently disabled \$1,500. Powell also reported that payments will increase in all categories this month.

The increases are being made possibly by a 44-cent State and Federal tax in September which will add \$4 million more into the public assistance program in Kentucky each year.

Statewide payments in September totaled \$1.5 million and went to more than 143,000 needy Kentuckians.
