Tobacco Festival plans complete

Final plans for the sixth annual Nicholas County Tobacco Festival have been made. Publicity chairman, S. R. Barlow, said this festival to be held at the Carlisle Armory November 3 would be the largest and best one ever held. The festival committee has planned for over \$150 in cash and merchandise to be given away. More tobacco warehouses are participating in this year's Special Entertainment to be arranged in Ira Mason, UK Tobacco Section will discuss better tobacco production during the afternoon program.

Lovell Holtar, Festival chairman, has asked all Nicholas county tobacco growers to start selecting their samples for showing. There will be classes for three leaf, bright leaf, red leaf, tip, best crop and best handled crop. Each leaf must be made up of 1200 leaves and three hands are required for each sample.

The festival is sponsored by neighboring tobacco warehouses, Utopia Club, Farm Bureau, Carlisle and Nicholas County Chamber of Commerce, Junior Chamber of Commerce, the County Extension Tobacco Committee and the County ASCS Committee.

Methodist to hold revival

Dr. John R. Church, known throughout the nation as one of the great evangelists of the Methodist Church, will be evangelist for a fall revival scheduled to start Thursday, November 1, at the Carlisle Methodist Church. The revival will continue through November 11.

Dr. Church, of Winston-Salem, North Carolina, has been preaching for forty years and has been an evangelist for the Methodist church for twenty-six years. During this time he has held revivals in forty-three states and has preached in more than thirty colleges and universities.

Born in 1886, Dr. Church has written seventeen books. Over two million copies of these books have been sold.

Joe Crause, widely acclaimed evangelistic singer, Wilmore, will conduct the revival and congregational choral during the services.

The Rev. G. S. Gardner, pastor of the local church, has announced that revival plans have been arranged under the direction of the local church committee on membership and evangelism of which Mrs. Sterling Hinkle is chairman.

Beginning the first day of November, services will be held each evening at 7:30. The public is invited to attend.

Wyatt lists advances made by Nicholas County

Lieutenant Governor Wilson Wyatt today listed advances this Democratic administration has helped Nicholas county in the last two and one-half years.

At the same time, he Democratic nominee for the United States Senate, challenged his Republican opponent, incumbent Franklin Morton, to show any of the Democratic influence noted the progress in Nicholas county schools in the period he has served as Lieutenant Governor.
