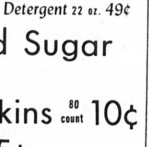
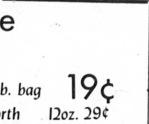

**Swine diseases
being studied**

With its battle against cat-
tle brucellosis almost won,
the State Department of
Agriculture is level at
attack on hog cholera, hog
brucellosis and other in-
fectious hog diseases.

The Department's Divi-
sion of Livestock Sanitation
expects cattle brucellosis to
be under control in all 120
counties during 1953. Each
county is now in some phase
of the program in which the
division gives free tests and
pays farmers for infected
animals which are destroyed.

Nicholas county is in the
testing phase of the pro-
gram. The Division under Dr.
W. Hammermeier, state
veterinarian, is now under-
taking the formulation
stage of the swine disease
program. The 1962 Legisla-
ture appropriated \$50,000
for each of the 1964-65 fi-
scal years to initiate the
campaign.

The legislation defines
hog cholera and brucellosis
as communicable diseases.
This means that inspectors
of the division have access
to premises to inspect, test,
quarantine or destroy in-
fected swine.
