New Teachers Employed at MMI
 Several appointments have been announced by Millersburg Military Institute of Instructors for the 1963-64 school term.
 David L. Evans, presently teaching at Wisconsin State College, has been appointed by the Board of Trustees to enter study for the position as President of MMI at the retirement of Colonel W. D. Hayes, currently the President of the Institute. Mr. Evans holds a B.S. Degree from the University of Tennessee and a Master's Degree from the University of Michigan. He plans to complete his doctorate at the University of Kentucky.
 Captain E. S. Thompson, who has served as Director of Music for the Institute for the past four years, has been promoted to the Post of Public Relations Director and will be replaced in the music department by Larry L. Versteeg of Vermillion, South Dakota. Mr. Versteeg holds a bachelor's degree in Music Education and a Master's Degree from the University of South Dakota.
 John Eugene Sullivan of Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin, has been assigned as an Instructor of Mathematics at the Senior Division of the Institute. He is a graduate of Wisconsin State College and served four years with the U.S. Air Force. Mr. Sullivan qualified as a member of the Service Rifle Team at the Air Force University, Pennsylvania, has been contracted as an instructor in the M.M.I. Junior Division. Mr. Parney received his college degrees in Psychology and Social Studies at Albright College. He was recently appointed to the Board of the National Collegiate Government Association.
 Wiley McWilliams of Lexington, has accepted a post as an Instructor at the Junior Division of M.M.I. He is a graduate of the University of Kentucky and has completed two years of post-graduate study at the University of Louisville. Military-wise, he has completed two years of ROTC training and two years of military service.
 Russell Sage of Ewing, Indiana will head Senior Division Commercial Department teaching Typing, Business Math, General Business and Bookkeeping.

Drive In Fayette Helps 4H Here
 A drive to raise \$14,000 in Fayette county to fill their quota in building a 4H Camp in Nicholas county.
 Drive officials said the county has already raised \$25,000 toward the \$39,000 goal. The money was raised by personal and private donations.
 Total cost of the camp is \$295,000. It will feature 14 buildings, which can be used year-round. Twenty-three cottages are also needed.
 There are 27 counties in the Central and Northern Kentucky District with 18,000 4-H members. There is no camp in the district. Only 1,400 members can be admitted to camps now serving the area.
 Officials emphasized this new facility will not need further contributions after it is constructed. No contributions for construction will be used for salaries, they stated.
 Some of the uses of the camp include District programs for training and recognition of 4-H members, 5,000 members and leaders annually.
 Twelve weeks of summer camps, 2,400 members.
 4-H leadership development meetings and other meetings and sessions which other youth organizations may hold.
 Construction has already begun on one of the buildings.
