You'll Be 'Glad I Came This Way' Butler Tells Farmers

Wendell P. Butler, Commissioner of Agriculture, addressed the 44th annual convention of the Kentucky Farm Bureau at Louisville, Butler was representing Edward T. "Red" Beattah, government elect.

Butler told the convention that the would serve the farmers of Kentucky in such a way that farmers will be "glad I came this way."

His speech was devoted mostly to the agricultural platform which the Democrats are conducting the general election. Butler pointed out that the most important part of the platform is to increase the agricultural income in Kentucky from \$650 million to \$1 billion during the next four years.

He read a telegram from Gov. select Beattah which said that during his term in office he would do everything in his power to make this increased farm income a reality.

"It might not be possible to do in four years," the telegram read, "but some hopes of comparable size have accomplished it," and we hope to do it, Beattah said.

In addition to the increased farm income, Butler touched on other points in the platform—rural roads, livestock, tobacco, etc., the University of Kentucky Agricultural Science Center at Lexington, the National Tobacco Research Station, conservation and education.

"We must increase the quality and quantity of our livestock," and we must work to a better re-education of our livestock raisers. To accomplish this, we need better teachers," he said.

For tobacco, Butler said, "we'll try to increase the price of tobacco during the selling season."

During a question and answer session following Butler's speech, he said nothing that he planned to go along with the present legislation working in the Department of Agriculture for the present, but might make some changes "at a time when he thought it necessary."

J. W. Welch, president, Kentucky Farm Bureau Federation, also addressed the convention today. In his presidential address, he said that "without the leadership and cooperation of the county office, state officers and members of the board of directors, our organization could not function effectively."

"I'll go one step further," Welch said, "without the support of our rank-and-file members, at the grass roots, the Kentucky Farm Bureau in the past year, he touched on legislation, the UK Agricultural Science Center, the National Tobacco Research Center at Lexington, the FB "Measure—the Cashaid" program, the national farm program, FB information program, the policy development process in FB, and other farm
