

MULCHES WILL ASSIST FALL SEEDING TO LIVE
When fall mulches were as dry in Kentucky as were September and October mulches may help fall seedlings survive.
Lyle Leonard, UK Agr Extension Service conservationist, says most soils were so dry this fall much of the sown seed did not germinate. Some germinated late and will make too little a start to get through the winter.

In such cases, he says, mulches will be helpful. If manure is available, a light covering protects young seedlings from cold enough to perhaps mean the difference between survival and loss. The manure also has considerable value as a fertilizer.

One Kentucky farmer used corncobs as a mulch. He shredded the stalks first and let the shredder blow the materials into a manure spreader; the mulch was spread with little loss of time and relatively little labor.

Leonard points out that mulches act as ground cover to check erosion where seedlings have had little growth.
"Whatever material is used should be spread thick enough to prevent smothering of the young plants. It is better to spread a generous amount of material over a large acreage than to spread more on a small acreage and smother some of the seedlings."

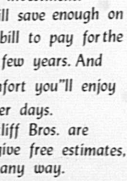
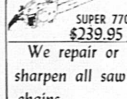
