Feed Grain Program
Offers Advance Payment
 Producers who take part in the 1962 feed grain program will receive payments for diverting acreage from the production of corn, grain sorghum, and barley. R. O. Wilson, Chairman, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation State Committee, said today that part of the estimated payment to be earned for such diversion may be paid in advance when the producer signs up to participate. The rest of the diversion support payment will be made next summer.

The chairman said that this program provision should be of substantial
