Services were conducted at 9 a.m. Monday at St. Charles.

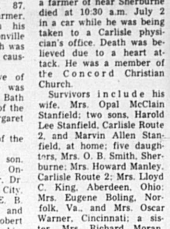
**Joe Lee Stanfield**
