Cut a 2 1/2-lb. Tablette round steak and rub with mixture of 1 tsp. salt, 1 tsp. pepper, 1/2 tsp. oregano, 1/2 tsp. clove. Brown on both sides in 1/2 cup Tablette Salad Oil. Transfer to greased casserole or baking dish. In skillet steep was browned in, saute 1 small chopped onion, 1 chopped green pepper, 1 branch celery and 1/2 lb. mushrooms, chopped.
