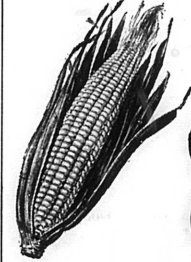

LIBRARY WEEK OBSERVED AT THE CITY SCHOOL
In compliance with the request of Mrs. Tommy Johnson, chairman of the Regional Library Program, that the schools participate in observing National Library Week with appropriate displays, the Carlisle City School elementary department went at it in a big way by featuring a display on the main floor of the school where it was viewed and reviewed by all entering the building. Teachers cooperated beautifully and came up with the most unusual and colorful eye-catchers calling for that second look.
The First grade room came up with a large tree in the branches were beautifully colored birds, each carrying in its bill a book.
The Second grade came out with a large beach scene of the eastern seaboard describing the book, One Morning in Maine, also there was a Shadow box of Somebody's Pup, plus a copy of each book.
The Third grade brought forth a large poster with pockets filled with titles of books, also a cigar box description of a book with a panoramic view of Prairie Schooners West plus wild Indians ready for the attack. Posters of Black Beauty and Peter Rabbit were added. An enchanting framed picture with the caption, "Never too Young to Read," amused everyone.
