With cake on its side, slice lengthwise into 5 thin layers. Place bottom slice on platter, cover with frosting, add next layer, frost, and repeat until cake is intact, then frost sides and top.

To make Mint-Chocolate Frosting: Combine 12 oz. semi-sweet chocolate chips, 1/4 cup TableRite Butter, and 1/2 cup TableRite Evaporated Milk in saucepan. Stir over low heat until chocolate melts.
