Nicholas County Lacks \$1800 In North Central 4H Drive
The North Central Kentucky 4H Camp Committee met Monday Nov. 18, planning to make final plans to complete county quotas for the 4H Camp under construction in Nicholas County. Four counties have reached their quota and several others to complete theirs this month. Approximately \$170,000 has been raised to date in the 27 county area with \$130,000 needed to complete the construction.
Nicholas County 4H Camp Fund goal was \$29,200. To date we have raised \$26,477.57, plus \$907.26 from District pledges which makes a total of \$27,384.83. This leaves us \$1915.17 short of the top.
We have had the stick of tobacco under construction the past two years and raised over \$1000 thru it. We are not going to have an all tobacco drive this year but know some farmers that do not even intend to do that. Anyone wishing to do so may leave it at the County Extension Office or call 36 and someone will pick it up. We have already donated this year and baiked down. Every dollar raised will make it available for more youth to attend camp.
