Task Force Named For TB Fight

Surgeon General Luther Terry's appointment of a task

force on the eradication of tuberculosis was applauded today by Dr. Asa Barnes, president of the Kentucky Tuberculosis Association.

"We feel this will give additional impetus to the campaign we have been waging in Kentucky to eradicate tuberculosis," Barnes said. He added that a Kentucky high TB rate (11.6 second in the nation) makes appointment of the task force especially significant.

"This should be a focus of attention on the fact that tuberculosis still causes more incapacity and death than 11 other communicable diseases combined," he said. So far this year, 1,175 new active cases have been reported in Kentucky, Barnes pointed out. Barnes added that in 1961 at a conference at the Campbell House in Lexington 28 authorities on tuberculosis, health and welfare met and outlined a blueprint for eradication of the disease in Kentucky. "We are working along with the U. S. Health Department and the Tuberculosis Hospital Commission to carry out the recommendations made at that conference," Barnes said, adding that appointment of the national task force for eradication will unquestionably lead to sound suggestions for improved methods of control and should further help us achieve our goals.

An announcing appointment of the task force which said it implements a recent recommendation from the Subcommittee on the Department of Labor and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare of the House Committee on Appropriations. Terry added that the committee was told that eradication could save the country an estimated \$50 million dollar a year.

The task force is expected to report its recommendations to Congress in the spring of 1964.

Consequently, production costs will tend to increase.

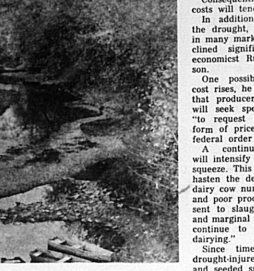
In addition, because of the drought, milk supplies in many markets have "declined significantly," said economist Russell Robertson.

One possible effect of cost rises, he said, may be that producer cooperatives will seek special hearings "to request relief in the form of price increases in federal order markets."

A continuing drought will intensify the cost-price squeeze. This in turn "will hasten the decline in total dairy cow numbers; heifers and poor producers will be sent to slaughter markets, and marginal producers will continue to drop out of dairying."

Since timely relief to drought-injured pastures and seeded small grains is "rather remote," Robertson said, "the aftermath of this drought may well affect supplies and prices well into 1964."
