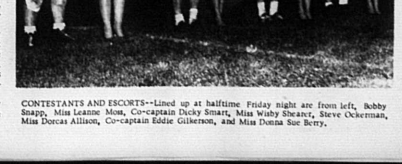
REPUBLICAN ORGANIZATION CHAIRMAN NAMED
