**Washington Report**

The Murder Syndicate  
A most terrifying tale of evil and corruption is now being revealed before the Senate Permanent Investigations Sub-Committee. A short story man who has turned informer, Joseph M. Valachi, is speaking for all to hear, about how extensively and thoroughly crime has become organized in the United States. It is this degree to which organized crime's tentacles reach out in all directions, which is one of the hearings' most shocking disclosures.

The organization, Cosa Nostra, meaning "our thing" in Italian, also is sometimes called the Mafia. The Syndicate or the Unione Siciliana. But by whatever name it be known, it is an organization conceived in and dedicated to evil with profitable crime as its singular objective. The hearings' star witness, Valachi, says its members are initiated in a blood ritual ceremony and are sworn to absolute silence and obedience to the rules. According to a government witness, one of the main difficulties in breaking up the syndicate and why it continues to live, is the organization's own policy of swift death for informers or those who weaken. The syndicate's sources of revenue are derived from a host of evils ranging from illegal gambling to narcotics. The testimony now being given would challenge the imagination of the very best of mystery writers. The cold, calculating ruthlessness of the syndicate's operations, as outlined by Valachi, transcends that of any other underworld character. "Mad Dog," "The Gap," "The Chicken Hand," "Trigger Mike," and "Three Finger Brown," to name just a few.

Unfortunately, beyond the nicknames and glossary of underworld terms, there is little that is entertaining in these hearings. Law abiding citizens can hope that these hearings will not be just a TV spectacle, temporarily replacing some of the soap operas in popularity, but will have meritorious effects.

Admittedly, Valachi's own history of violent crime and long police record does not make his testimony free from suspect. Nevertheless, the number of unsolved crimes and murders is such that this situation should be thoroughly investigated. Because the crime syndicate spreads across state lines, it does seem wise for Congress to study what Federal laws could be enacted to help eradicate such crime and yet not jeopardize the Constitutional rights of law abiding citizens. It is hoped these hearings may result in the enactment of Federal laws to terminate this cancerous evil of organized crime.
