tory of America is recorded in the works of these artists—the stirring events, the faces of the patriots, the manners and customs of the people, the places and scenes, the growth of Democracy and the spirit of Liberty, and WHEREAS, there is a great treasury of American painting from all periods of our history. American artists have ranked with the best in Europe, and the artists who also achieved the art of language, a history of civilization, the educator, the main promoter of creativity, inventiveness. Art is the essence of excellence for which we as a nation strive.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, William Power Mayor of the City of Carlisle, Kentucky do hereby proclaim November 17, 1963, to be American Art Week in Carlisle and urge all citizens to acquaint themselves more fully with American Art and Artists and to encourage and assist in developing artistic talent in young Americans.

CONGRESSMAN WATTS DECRIES LACK OF AIR SERVICE
Congressman John C. Watts (D. Ky.) today decry the lack of adequate air service to Lexington. He said "Air service for Lexington, already inadequate, is continuing to deteriorate while the cost to passengers and the loss to the economy are increasing."
In letters directed to the airlines concerned and to Alan S. Boyd, Chairman of the Civil Aeronautics Board, the Federal agency charged with the responsibility of developing a balanced air transportation system for the United States, Congressman Watts said "Over the past five years, the three airlines serving Lexington—Eastern, Delta, and TWA—have reduced to a single flight a day, although

9,000 passengers annually fly this route. Worse still, there is only one flight daily from Lexington to New York, although nearly 13,000 passengers close to 10 percent of Lexington's traffic traveled this route in 1960. In the case of Washington, D. C., the number of flights has been reduced and the scheduling is poorer, despite the fact that traffic is up 30 percent."

In view of the needs of the people and the economy of the expanding Central Kentucky area, Congressman Watts urged that this service, for over 2,000 passengers traveled annually to Philadelphia and St. Louis, be restored to Lexington.

The eleven major cities to which service has been greatly curtailed are Atlanta, Charleston, Louisville, Chicago, Cincinnati, Greensboro, Huntington, Indianapolis, Knoxville, Louisville, New York, and Washington, D. C. All of these cities have important economic and other ties with Lexington which the reduction seriously weakens.
Congressman Watts said "There should be an increase in service to Cincinnati and Louisville to accommodate 1,000 to 2,000 travelers taking connecting flights for the Midwest, Far West and South. At present, such travelers must either drive 80 miles to take a connecting flight or sit through intolerable hours in airports waiting for one."
Congressman Watts further stated "Incredible as it may seem, service between Lexington and Chicago has been reduced to a single flight a day, although
