**Time to Seed Alfalfa**  
April is the time to seed alfalfa. It provides the right type soil is selected and proper fertility applied. The best drained land on the farm should be selected. Apply lime and fertilizer according to need as shown by the soil test. Prepare a firm seedbed. Inoculate the seed, use a recommended variety and cover the seed with adapted grass and legume mixtures. The best simple method is to turn to page 4.
