HEALTH DEPARTMENT LUGES BUTTER IS SEWAGE SYSTEMS

In complying with the sewage regulation passed by the Nicholas County Board of Health, July 26, 1963, anyone interested in installing a sewage system of any type, is required to obtain a permit from the county health department. It is free of charge. The regulation calls for a minimum of 200 feet of tile field and no septic tank smaller than 500 gallons.

The Health Department should be contacted before work begins and the system is to be inspected by the sanitarian before system is covered up. The septic tank should be at least 50 feet from the home water supply and the tile field no closer than 70 feet. This is to help prevent water supply contamination.
Cess pools and seepage pits shall not be installed because they do not give sewage proper treatment and provide more chance for water contamination. A proper system guards against surface contamination which contributes to many diseases.
