Hunting Season
Frankfort, (Special) -- Kentucky's crowded hunting season became a second half of split season when one new season opened and another two or more days were reserved. Minor Clark, commissioner of the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources, announced.

The grouse, in an extended season this year, became legal game on December 1 and hunting for this fast-flying wood bird will continue through February 28, 1965, in the longest season in recent years for this target. The bag limit is four with a possession limit of eight after two or more days of hunting. The grouse is found mostly in eastern Kentucky and reports indicate a good population of birds this year.

Love hunters will have another thing in a second phase of the season which opened December 1 and extends through December 10. As in the first phase only afternoon hunting will be permitted and the same rules apply. The squirrel hunter, in an eastern tier of counties where the season opened later than in the western zone, will have 14 additional days to hunt Mr. Oliver.

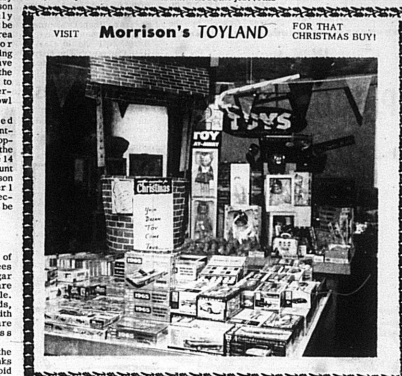

Counties to be open during this season are: Lewis, Rowan, Monticello, Powell, Estill, Jackson, Rockcastle, Pulaski and McCreary and all counties lying to the east of this group. The bag limit is two with a possession limit of 12 after two or more days of hunting.

The duck and goose hunting season opened on the Ballard County Wildlife Management Area on December 1, with the duck season ending on January 3 and the goose season on January 15. Only morning hunting will be permitted on this area with no Sunday or Christmas Day hunting and persons must have reservations with the Refuge Manager prior to the day of hunting. Otherwise statewide waterfowl regulations apply.

and extreme temperature changes as the sun sets in the winter. Many young trees seldom have much trunk injury in the forest. When these same kinds of trees are planted in the lawn where the late afternoon sun is full on them, winter-burn often results. Many trees should be wrapped in winter-burn as the trunk increases in diameter, the bark flakes or ridges, and the limbs above begin to shade the trunk below. Full set trees should have their trunks wrapped to prevent winter-burn. Any wrap can be used

Your Share Of Wildlife Crop

"When it comes to hunting and fishing the American public have never had it so good," State Conservationist Homer Jaff said yesterday. "Our Soil Conservation Service biologists estimate we have more kinds and greater numbers of game birds, mammals, fur-bearing animals, and game fish in the United States than were here when the first white men set foot on American soil."

"The trouble is," he added, "this wildlife is not equally distributed among states and among farms. Some Kentucky farms are not harboring so much as one lone song sparrow."

Jaff agreed that not all game birds and other animals, but he pointed out that land that doesn't use some form of game strips or other animals is probably also short of the kinds of wildlife people like to have around for entertainment and personal enjoyment.
