prices by grades held generally form with those of food week. The percentage of sales paid and Government loan was also about the same. Quality of offerings was slightly better.

Gross sales in the eight-state marketing area for the week ending December 11, totaled 164,597,701 pounds and averaged \$61.87 per hundred. For the Federal - State Market News Service. This average was on 85 cents under the one for opening week. Season marketing were raised to 330,164,215 pounds averaging \$62.04. During the same number of days last year, a record volume of 366,139,000 gross pounds averaged \$59.37.

Average prices for around half of the grades were unchanged from opening week. Variations in other offerings amounted to only \$100 per most cases, with gains in selected hogs and hogs brought top prices of \$75.00 a hundred pounds.

Quality of the tobacco was a little lower because of an increase in the percentage of nonproducer offerings. Principal marketing was Moorefield to low to good leaf and low to fair flying logs.

Estimated receipts placed under Government loan this week amount to about 15 per cent of the comparable period last year, around 20 per cent was placed under loan. The heaviest volume grade going under loan this year has been good tan leaf (B).
