

Regional Library Annual Report

The annual report of the Nicholas County Memorial Library and the Nicholas County Bookmobile circulation in 1964: adult books, 25,754 juvenile books, 739 records, 47 pictures and 276 reference questions answered. New members registered total 404. There were 1,032 adult books and 549 juvenile

books added by the State Department and 26 adult books and 18 juvenile books added by the local library.

The Summer Reading Program for children was held for six weeks on Saturday mornings during June and July. Better service was given by being open on Monday nights from 7 to 9.
