TABLE LISTS the Kentucky sales tax deductions which the taxpayer may take on his Federal and State income tax returns for 1963. Every Kentucky resident who itemizes deductions for the calendar year 1963 or the fiscal year beginning on or after July 1, 1963 may use the table. If the standard \$500 deduction is taken on the State Income tax, no sales tax deduction will be allowed. If the table is not used and sales tax is deducted, annual total of sales tax payments must be reported.
