

## Poison Control Centers Listed in Kentucky

Lexington, Ky.—Nine poison-control centers and one poison information central have been established in Kentucky, the U. K. Ag Extension department pointed out this week.

The control centers maintain extensive files on potentially toxic substances which may be swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. The centers provide technical information to physicians, veterinarians and other individuals whose activities and responsibilities occasionally require services of this kind.

The Poison Information Central is at the University of Kentucky School of Pharmacy. This facility main-

tains a committee of specialists available for consultation whenever regional center files lack sufficient information on a specific substance.

The poison control centers are: King's Daughters' Hospital, Ashland; St. Luke's General Hospital, Fort Thomas; Department of Pediatrics, 323 East Chestnut Street, Louisville; Porter Moore Drug Co., Berea; Harlan Memorial Hospital, Harlan; Owensboro-Davess County Hospital, Owensboro; Bowling Green-Warren County Hospital, Bowling Green; Central Baptist Hospital, Lexington; and Western Baptist Hospital, Paducah.

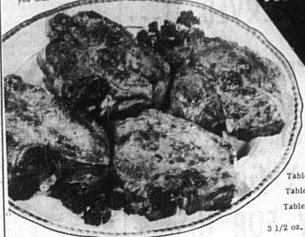

**ALIENS MUST REPORT ADDRESSES DURING JANUARY**  
Thomas M. Pederson, District Director of the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service stated that the period within which aliens must report their addresses is almost at hand.

The month of January has been set for the address reporting period. All aliens in the United States, with few exceptions, must report their addresses to the Government during that period. Mr. Pederson said that forms with which to make the report will be available to all post offices and offices of the Immigration and Naturalization Service during the month of January.

Mr. Pederson urges all aliens to comply with the reporting requirements, as willful failure to do so may lead to serious consequences.
