K U Stock Approved
The common stock of Kentucky Utilities Company, Lexington, was approved today (January 23) for listing on the New York Stock Exchange by the NYSE Board of Governors. Trading will begin Monday, February 17.

To be listed on the Exchange are 5,387,592 shares of the company's common stock. Kentucky Utilities and its subsidiary, Old Dominion Power Company, provide electric service for 240,000 customers in 78 of Kentucky's 120 counties, five counties in southwestern Virginia and one county in northwestern Tennessee.

The counties are: Harroan, Boone, Bracken, Breathitt, Breckinridge, Cumberland, Edmonson, Elliott, Fleming, Franklin, Gallatin, Greenup, Lawrence, Lee, Leslie, Madison, Meade, Metcalfe, Morgan, Nicholas, Powell, Simpson, Trigg, Warren and Wolfe.

Persistent drought and shortage of hay and pasture caused the USDA action. About 24 counties already had received the privilege. Farmers must obtain approval of their county ASC officers before harvesting hay or grazing livestock on the released lands. There are some other requirements, too, that should be checked out with the local ASC offices.

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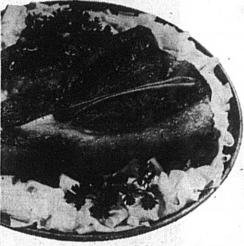
