This is not a foregone conclusion, let's remember and respond accordingly. Never has Nicholas County had sufficient tax revenue to cover all necessary roads and bridges, and other improvements especially maintenance and repair as were by Bond Issues, and other Govt. Loans. Can we expect to have loans and new revenue borrowed because of our own stupidity? We appreciate the response our Nicholas County citizens have made in the past year for worthy causes, all are to be recommended but not fall down when so little effort is needed to make the proper adjustment.
A good way to discover our lack of taxes already would be to take a drive on the county roads—some have been improved and for this we are thankful. But in one particular section I am aware of the tax payers have appealed and pleaded for road and bridge repair—but "there was just not enough money to go around". However, part of the road received some repair and after years the bridge got some attention but not until these tax payers had to pay added costs to get their fertilizer hauled, the ready-made concrete for necessary construction, rocks for their private roads trucked in, and the bridge bought from the county. The school bus driver let the children out to walk across in all kinds of weather. The county grader would not cross the bridge to grade the road and drove many miles around to grade less than a half mile. These Tax payers continued to pay their Tax Assessments. They are still waiting for one end of this road to be completed. We heard the most complaint from out of state
