Crash Fatal To Five As Car, Truck Collide

Five members of a Bourbon County family lost their lives Sunday afternoon when the two vehicles collided about three miles east of Carlisle, at a traffic light. State Trooper James Peck said the car was loaded west on Ky. 26 and the truck was eastbound on U. S. 68. The truck driver, J. D. Fuller, 33, Dallas, Ga., entered a plea of innocent when Nicholas County Judge Fred C. Williams held a hearing on the September grand jury under \$2,500 bond. He later posted bond in this amount guaranteeing his appearance in September. The dead were identified as Ronald Perry, 29, driver of the car; his wife, Mrs. Betty Sue Perry, 27, their children Ricky Lynn, 4, and Rhonda Annette, 3, and Mrs. Perry's sister, Patricia Booth, 24.
