

UK TRUSTEES APPROVE ARCHITECTURE SCHOOL

The University of Kentucky Department of Architecture will become a school of Architecture on July 1. The UK Board of Trustees, which authorized the change at a recent meeting, approved the appointment of Prof. Charles P. Graves as dean of the school. Professor Graves has been chairman of the Department of Architecture since its establishment in 1960 as part of the University's College of Engineering. In approving creation of the department in 1959, the trustees agreed that should achieve the status of a school within five years.

UK MUSIC DEPARTMENT SLATES 3 WORKSHOPS

Three music workshops, each of a week's duration, will be held during June at the University of Kentucky. The first, scheduled for June 8-12, is for elementary school classroom teachers and music specialists. Next, from June 15-19, will be a workshop for high school band members. The third event, for high school choral students, is set for June 22-26. Three nationally known music educators—from Florida, Michigan and Texas—will direct the workshops, which are sponsored by the UK Department of Music and the Division of Extended Programs.

UK COMMERCE COLLEGE HAS NEW ACTING DEAN

Dr. Robert W. Budd, professor of agricultural economics at the University of Kentucky, has been named acting dean of the UK College of Commerce, effective July 1. He will succeed Dr. Cecil C. Carpenter, who last January requested that he be relieved of administrative duties and research post. Dr. Carpenter has been dean of the college since 1948. University President John W. Oswald said Dr. Budd will serve until a screening committee recommends a permanent successor to Dean Carpenter.

KNITTERS, CROCHETERS TO COMPLETE LOCALLY: THEN NATIONALLY
Knitters and crocheters from Maine to California will be needing their way to fame against fellow needlework hobbyists this year as contestants in the 1964 National Wool Needlework Contest.

Entries for the nationwide competition, being held for its second successive year, will be submitted for judging locally at the Nicholas County Youth Fair, which takes place from August 13 to August 15. No entries may be made directly to the contest's national headquarters.

Contestants must initially win a first prize in the judging being held at the Nicholas County Youth Fair, before being eligible for the national judging, which is to be held in New York late in 1964.

All articles submitted for judging in the 1964 National Wool Needlework contest must be either crocheted or 100% wool or mohair yarn. Entries must have been completed since January 1st, 1964 and each entry

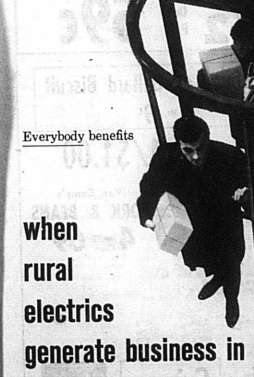

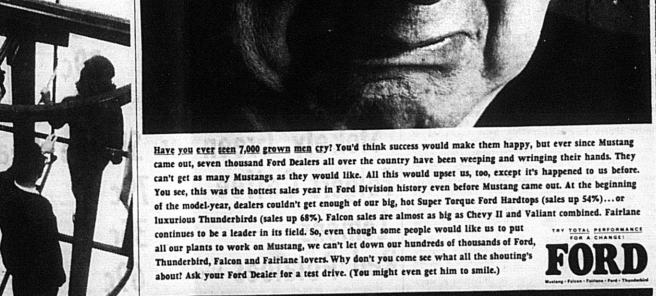
