Farmers and Medicare

To anyone who wonders why many farmers are opposed to increasing social security taxes to pay for medical care, one of the answers can be found in the boost in the self-employed tax rate.

Under the proposed legislation, the farm operator would have to pay \$301.50 now, and in 1966 and after, it would climb to \$379.60 annually. The 1968 payment is based on a rate of 7.3 percent on a maximum earnings of \$5,200, as compared with the current \$4,800 base.

You don't have to be an expert at arithmetic to figure that some farmers would be paying more in social security taxes than in federal income taxes. This would be an additional burden on a group that is already paying a stupendous and ever-increasing property tax. When you look at the tax bill, you can see why many farmers have to pay on every acre before they even start to think about the ordinary production expenses of planting and harvesting a crop, it appears that agricultural producers are working mostly for the tax collector.

Most people don't realize it, but the social security tax rate on the self-employed has risen six times since 1963, and even without our new legislation, will go up again in 1966 to 6.2 percent and in 1968 to 6.9 percent.

The rate of 6.9 percent for 1968 and thereafter represents an increase of 207 percent since 1953, and under the new proposal for medical care, the rate would go to 7.3, or an increase of 224 percent in the same period. The new rate also would be on a base of \$5,200 instead of \$4,800.

What's to stop the rate from being increased after 1968, or even before that year is reached? Absolutely nothing that the public opinion that agricultural producers have proved much of a safeguard up to the present. The Social Security Act of 1953 has had 65 amendments with as many as 17 amendments in one Congress. Employees can't be expected to raise much clamor as the social security tax, a deferred form of taxation,

Peace Corps

Since again Congress has given its stamp of approval to the Peace Corps, The House of Representatives this week approved legislation to expedite the continuation of this organization.

While nothing the Federal Government ever does is absolutely perfect and there is always some degree of mismanagement, the Peace Corps has achieved an outstanding record of accomplishments and set a remarkable example for other Government departments to emulate. In my own opinion, of all the foreign aid programs that can be assisted, the Peace Corps is by far the best and has been the most effective in promoting "know how" and "good will" abroad.

A testimonial to the success of the Peace Corps is reflected by enthusiasm with which it is received by the people of the Peace Corps now has volunteers working in 46 countries and not a single country has requested that the program be terminated. In fact, almost without exception, these countries instead have asked for substantial numbers of volunteers sent to them. The Peace Corps has not even been able to include all of the countries requesting to participate in the program.

Successful as this program has been abroad, it has also retained its appeal for the American public.
