

EASTER SEALS
The 1964 Easter Seal Campaign, benefiting thousands of crippled children in Kentucky, will be conducted by the Kentucky Society for Crippled Children from March 1 through March 29, Easter Sunday.



Contributions to the annual drive help support a statewide program of services, including hospitalization, out-patient therapy, and resident camping. The program provides for children crippled by accidents, birth defects or disease, such as polio or cerebral palsy.

Approximately 450,000 letters containing Easter Seals will be mailed this year to residents in all of Kentucky's 120 counties. In addition to the mail appeal, volunteer workers throughout the state plan to hold special events to raise funds to support the Society's programs.

The 1964 Easter Seal design the stylized Easter lily, official emblem of the Easter Seal Society, in alternating green and orange against a white background. "Easter Seals" is lettered across the top and "Help Crippled Children" is in two lines at the bottom. The slogan this year is "The first step is yours — your gift to Easter Seals."

Last year the Society helped 4,842 Kentuckians, reported Dr. Kelly Thompson, Bowling Green state campaign chairman.

"The number of physically handicapped in the state is becoming greater each year," he said. "Our goal is to provide more of the necessary treatment for more crippled children in Kentucky."
