Parcel Post Rates Up

The Post Office Department announces that, effective Wednesday, April 1, there was a raise in Parcel Post rates. The average was approximately 13 percent. This rate of raise will be reflected in parcels mailed in the lower zones and lowest in the farthest mailings. For example parcels weighing one pound and not exceeding two pounds in size 3c in zone one and two, the new rate will be 40c with smaller percentage increases to more distant points.

The rates for parcels weighing less than one pound remains unchanged, 2c per ounce, minimum rate 4c.
