"This ain't hay"
said Norwood Axster of East Union, as he and his son, Dean, examine silage they are feeding to dairy cows. "Norwood and Dean Axster have a 125 ton bunker silo which is filled annually with five acres of corn. "I can't recall that yield with any other crop," said Axster. Forty pounds of silage per cow, a little hay and a mixture of grain and supplement makes contented cows and, like a factory, they convert raw materials into a marketable product—milk. W. F. Theisfeld of the Soil Conservation Service recommends the use of new crop-on-bottom land and use the upland for hay and pasture. We use our land that way, explained Axster, because it is wise land use. Axster is Vice-Chairman of the 314 school's Soil Conservation District Board of Supervisors.
