**SEWER ORDINANCE RULES AND REGULATIONS** — The building sewer shall be cast iron soil pipe, ASTM A74, latest revision; vitrified clay sewer pipe, ASTM C200, latest revision. Any part of the building sewer that is located within five feet of a water service pipe shall be constructed with cast iron soil pipe with lead joints. Cast iron pipe with rubber joints may be required by the Director where the building sewer is exposed to damage or stoppage by tree roots. The Director may also require cast iron soil pipe with lead joints in filled or unfillable ground.

The size and slope of the building sewer shall be submitted to the approval of the Director. In general, the building sewer shall be the same size as the service branch but in no event less than six inches in diameter, except in case of pipe in five foot or longer lengths or with machines shall be with which it shall not be less than four inches. The slope of the building sewer shall in no event be less than one-eighth inch per foot.

No building sewer shall be laid parallel to or within three feet of any building wall which might thereby be weakened. The depth of the sewer shall be sufficient to allow protection from frost. The building sewer shall be laid at uniform grade and in straight alignment insofar as possible. Changes in direction shall be made only with properly curved pipe and fittings.

In all buildings in which any building drain is too low to permit gravity flow to the public sewer, sanitary sewage carried by such drain shall be lifted by approved artificial means and discharged to the building sewer.

All excavations required for the installation of a building sewer shall be open trench work unless otherwise approved by the Director. Pipe laying and backfilling shall be performed in accordance with A.S.T.M. Specification C12, latest revision. Subgrade of trench supporting pipe shall be firm earth, six inch pad of crushed rock or solid rock, or if unstable earth, stabilized by crushed rock pad to a 1 ft or backfill. Subgrade shall be snaped to give uniformity of each pipe length. Bell holes shall be dug. Backfill shall be carefully tamped in and around pipe to conform to line for proper support. Backfilling shall be placed in layers and solidly tamped up to two feet above the pipe. No backfill shall be placed until the pipe laying has been inspected by the Director or his authorized representative.

All joints and connections shall be made gas tight and water tight. All joints in vitrified clay pipe with approved cast factory made, annular rings on spigot and in "two lock" PVC butted with suitable water tight material and joints completely homed with no greater than one-fourth inch gap between barrels of connected pipe.

The building sewer shall be connected into the public sewer at the curb or property line, if a service branch or lateral sewer is available at a suitable location. Where no lateral sewer is available, an authorized agent of the Director shall cut a neat hole into the main line of the public sewer and install a suitable water or tee saddle and extend a service branch sewer to receive the building sewer. The invert of the service branch sewer at such joint of connection with a water saddle shall be in the upper quadrant of the main line of the public sewer.

The Downing family connection not extending past the inner surface of the main public sewer shall be made and the saddle made secure and tight by encasement in concrete.

The applicant for the building sewer permit shall notify the Director when the building sewer is ready for inspection and connection to the public sewer. The connection may be made under the supervision of the Director or his representative.

All excavations for building sewer installations shall be adequately guarded with barricades and lights so as to protect the public from hazard on streets, sidewalks, and parkways, and other public property satisfactory to the City of Carlisle, Kentucky.

Old building sewers may be used in connection with new system only when they are found on examination and tested by the Director to

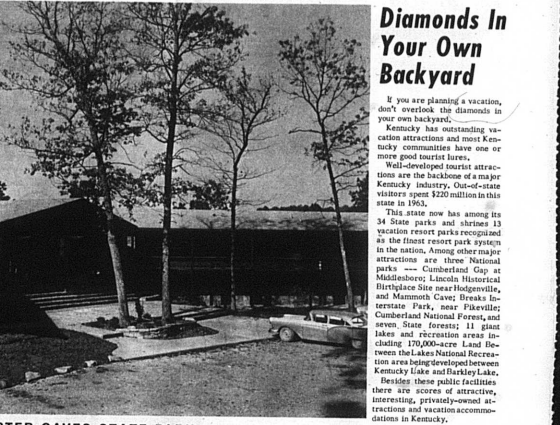
