QUESTION: I am 16 years old and my mother is receiving social security payments for me. If I work during the summer, will my payments stop?

ANSWER: You are allowed to make \$1200 per year without loss of benefits. Unless you exceed this amount, your benefits will not be affected.

QUESTION: After age 72, I understand I can receive all social security benefits regardless of earnings, but do I still have to pay the social security tax?

ANSWER: Yes, there are no age limits, minimum or maximum, that excuse the tax. As long as you have earnings under the law, the tax must be collected and paid.

ANSWER: NO. Under present law benefits stop at paid.
