

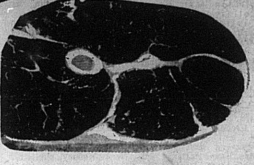
Deaths

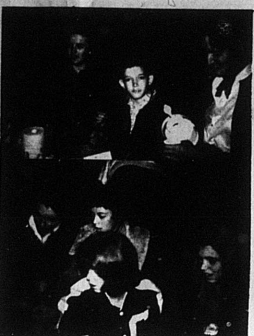
