**THREE ARRESTS**

**\$7300 Latonia Profits To Ohio Medical School**

Florence, Ky., Oct.—Jockeys Bill Shoemaker, Bill Hartman and James Valenzuela, teamed with an enthusiastic group of medical men in the greater Cincinnati area to make opening day at Latonia Race Course last September a happy occasion for all concerned—namely the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine.
