WOMEN VOTERS FOR VOTERS
After every election, the League of Women Voters of Kentucky receives many complaints from voters regarding violations at the polls, according to Mrs. Thomas B. Stroup, Lexington, State League president.
"The League believes that most precinct officers and voters want to comply with the law and that violations are frequently due to a misunderstanding and lack of information," Mrs. Stroup said.
Some of the provisions of Kentucky elections are:
1. To vote, a person must be REGISTERED in the precinct in which he lives.
2. On entering the polling place, each voter must SIGN HIS NAME in the Comparative Signature Book and enter the voting booth ALONE.
3. NO ASSISTANCE shall be given in the booth unless the voter stands UNDER the ballot, is blind, disabled or illiterate.

4. NO ELECTIONEERING, including leading out campaign material and soliciting votes is allowed inside the polls nor within 50 feet of the polling place.
5. NO PERSONS ALLOWED in polling places except election officers, challengers and voters.
6. A voter's eligibility to vote may be CHALLENGED at the polls by a challenger. A challenged voter may sign affidavit of eligibility.
7. NO voter shall be FRIGHTENED, INTIMIDATED, THREATENED or COERCED.
8. If irregularities occur, they should be called to the attention of the precinct sheriff. Mrs. Stroup said, adding that the county sheriff and election commissioners should be notified if there is need for further action.
