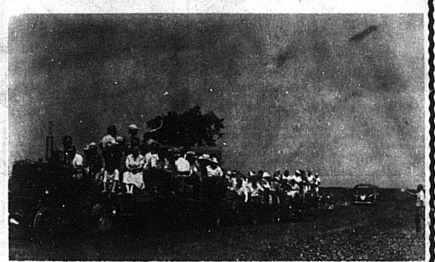

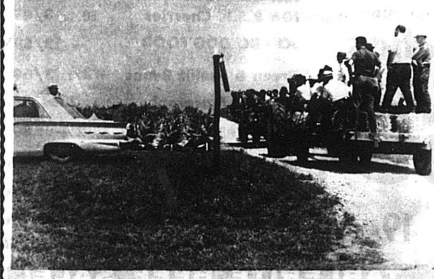
OVER 500 TOBACCO GROWERS ATTEND CONSERVATION FIELD DAY AT CLAY'S SEED FARM



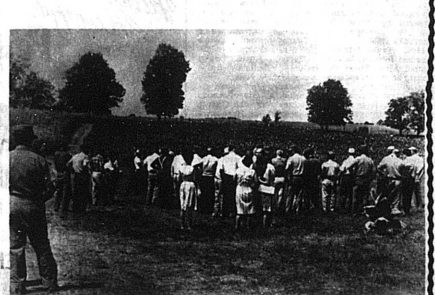
PEOPLE CAME FROM TWO STATES besides 30 Kentucky counties to observe tests and projects at the Clay Seed Farm on the Walnut Grove Road, Nicholas County on August 5. Besides the seed farm, the A.S.C.S., Soil Conservation Service and Extension personnel were on hand to explain programs, such as summer plant bed management and fall treatment, making hybrid seed, variety test plots, barn curing equipment, pasture and hay seedings, pond construction, road waterways, diversion channels, black light for catching insects and many other interesting practices.



THREE WAGON LOADS--Drawn by a tractor are enroute to a new test plot. Edgar Allen Darroll is their guide.



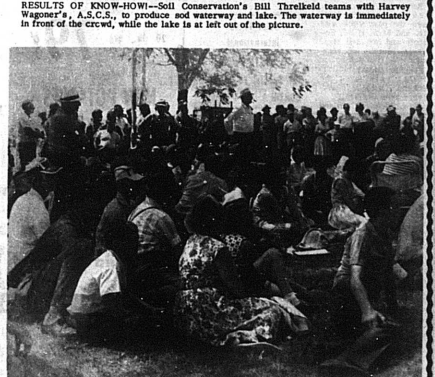
IRA MASSIE, University of Kentucky Tobacco Specialist, addresses several trailer loads of interested farmers at one of the UK Variety Test Plots.
