Carlisle National Guard Unit Now Part of Super Ready Reserve

Carlisle, Ky.—A series of rapid promotions and events during the past week has given the National Guard Unit in Carlisle a new name, and completely new mission, and a change of Command personnel.
The events all came about during the first ten days in Dec. In order to quickly provide Kentucky's "Selected Reserve Forces" additional trained personnel who could respond to the accelerated training which was called for by Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara last September.
In a redesignation of units, all the National Guard personnel in Carlisle were transferred to the Flash Ranging Platoon of Battery 5th Target Acquisition Battalion, 138th Artillery. The parent unit is located in Lexington, however, these two platoons will be stationed here and will continue to be commanded by Carlisle National Guard Army. The changeover will be completed by the Carlisle unit (previously located here, Battery C, 3d Howitzer Battalion, 138th Artillery, was moved to Richmond with all of its guns and equipment on Dec. 8th. The former unit was reorganized as Captain Jerry W. Heaton, Lexington, has been transferred to the staff of the 5th Target Acquisition Battalion in Lexington.
The 5th Target Acquisition Battalion will be commanded by Lieutenant Colonel James M. Heaton (brother of the former Battery Commander of the "Selected Reserve Force" (SRF) unit).
