An Industry Is Born

An industry was born in Carlisle in February, 1948, when 57 businessmen pledged themselves to put up \$100 each and organize the Blue Grass Industries, Inc. Today this company has traveled quite a distance. From 12 employees to 650 workers, 515 at the local plant and 135 at Mt. Sterling; from a weekly payroll of \$350 to one of \$35,000; from a remodeled garage to a modern well-equipped plant from a few hundred dozen T-shirts to 30,000 T-shirts got underway Thursday, April 8, 1948. Then on the week beginning April 11, 1948, there appeared in the window of the C.C. Cole Co., a T-shirt, the first to come off the production line, thus marking the successful achievement of local residents and a manufacturer of wearing apparel.

Another year passed and saw the beginning of a complete line of children's clothing. This operation was set up in the old ice plant in 1950, which was purchased and remodeled by the company to accommodate the line of goods. This same year it was necessary to lease a building on East Main Street for the Cutting Department.

Continuing the journey, 1951 finds the road widening as a unit is set up in Mt. Sterling employing approximately 50 people. In 1952, the milestone is reached in 1956 as the company negotiates a contract with two name brand retailers for the manufacture of elastic goods.

The way was made easier as plans materialized in 1959 to consolidate all operations in Carlisle under one roof. At this time six locations were being used for the company's manufacturing needs. During the construction period an additional contract for men's underwear was won. In January, 1960, the company moved into its new home.

In October, 1961, one of the finest honors that can be bestowed on a contractor became a reality, as the company was given a contract to produce knit underwear. A complete readjustment training program was required for this production, but this step of the journey was completed successfully in less than one year as quality and production schedules were met.

Blue Grass Industries, Inc. saw many goals accomplished in 1964. 1. The plant was completely air-conditioned. 2. An addition to the present facilities increased the floor space from 36,000 square feet to 54,000 square feet. 3. Dining room facilities were completed with a seating capacity of 300 people and ample vending machines and food service to serve the entire personnel. Also, this area may be used as an auditorium for company programs. 4. Modern office furniture and equipment were installed for additional clerical help to provide modern methods for the most efficient service. 5. A 15 year service club was organized for the personnel and christened "Blue Grass Thoroughbreds." Thirteen employees have already completed the service requirements for membership.
