Stocked last year were 13 smaller streams in various sections of Kentucky and larger streams through River, Hickok and Cumberland Lakes. Telephone Talk

"Mr. Watson, Are you there? Do you hear me?" "Yes, Mr. Bell. I hear you perfectly. It is as clear as if you were here in New York instead of being more than 3,000 miles away."

That was the way the first transcontinental telephone call began on January 25, 1915. Alexander Graham Bell was in New York, and his former assistant, Thomas A. Watson was in San Francisco. Speaking from special book-ends were President of A. T. & T. in North Carolina, and Theodore N. Vail, president of the Bell Telephone Company, in New York. The first transcontinental telephone call was made on this day.

When transcontinental telephone service started, American business was booming. The Panama Canal was about to be just finished plans for the first assembly line. This would connect cities and towns all over America. The first transcontinental line and subsequent developments in telephone communication, meant jobs for thousands in an industry that was making an important place for itself in the American economy.

The line itself was copper wire that ran 3,400 miles through 13 states from New York to San Francisco. It was strung over 130,000 poles, weighed almost 3,000 tons and took 5 years to finish. Once it was built, developments in later years made it possible to carry more and more calls over a single line, and do it at decreasing cost at time went by. Shortly after 1915, three minutes of coast-to-coast conversation cost one dollar!

Today, when we can call Europe, Asia, and many remote parts of the world, it is pretty difficult to realize the tremendous difficulties involved in setting up a transcontinental telephone line. It was one of the really great developments of the telephone history. An event that helped change the telephone from mere curiosity to necessity.

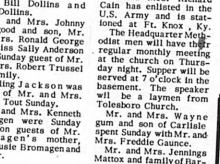
