Practically all these measures can be reclaimed by proper handling of stalks says George Cooper of the U.S. Ag Extension Service.

Spread these stalks on lawns, pastures, meadows or small grain fields, this fall or next spring.

If spread this fall on lawns, pastures, etc., living root systems will pick up the nutrients as they leach out. Next spring there will be little loss of nutrients if these stalks are spread on cultivated fields and plowed or disked in.

Stalks from mosaic susceptible varieties or black shank infected fields should not be used on tobacco beds or tobacco fields.

One ton of burley tobacco stalks contains about \$12.50 worth of nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium. Dark tobacco contains a somewhat larger amount of nutrients because of its higher nitrogen content. It is not fertilized as heavily as in burley.

Limiting Acid Farm Soils At Atomic War Overcome

How can applying ground limestone to fields be done in a safe way? This was the question asked by D. Cooper, U.S. Ag Extension Service soils specialist.

(1) All growing plants need calcium. If it is lacking, the plants take up more of other elements chemically similar to it. Calcium is an integral part of limestone.

(2) Strontium 90 is a product of atomic bomb. It will come in fallout and get onto farm soils. It will remain in the soil a considerable time and can replace calcium in plants.

(3) Crops growing on soils that have strontium 90 will take up less Strontium 90. If the soil should become contaminated with this fallout material. Adequate calcium in the soil may cause the up-take as much as 50 percent.

(4) Calcium in ground limestone will be there for the growing crop

when they need it, as well as making other plant nutrients in the soil and fertilizers more available to growing crops.

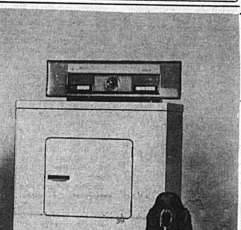

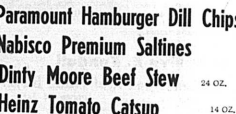
