**Farm Facts**

**POULTRY - A GROW-UP ENTERPRISE.** I know of no change in agriculture that has been as great as that in poultry production. Up until World War II the poultry flock was one of the mainstays of almost every farm family. Usually it was the woman's job to tend after the chickens. She hatched the chicks either under the old hen or, if the family was prosperous enough to own one, in an incubator. The latter was usually kept in a spare bedroom or in the company parlor. The small producers raised the chicks with the mother hen; the larger producers had 10' x 10' brooder houses with kerosene or coke stoves, and a canopy to keep them from coming have broilers to sell at Easter. At that time the wife's job was a luxury and brought a high price. Income from the flock was usually considered the wife's pin money being hers to clothe herself and children, buy Christmas presents, furnish the home and provide the niceties of life. In bad years, especially during the great drought of 1930 and in the depression years, poultry and egg money was commended to help pay the taxes and grocery bills. 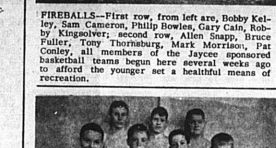
