Southern Bell Adds New Cable
A \$25 million cable-
retention cable route that
adds 9,000 telephone
circuits to the 15,000 now
spanning the country was
announced Tuesday by
Southern Bell Telephone
Company.
The new cable system
passes through 19 states
including Kentucky, ac-
cording to C. A. Harris,
manager for Southern
Bell Telephone Company.
The 4,000-mile cable
was built with a series of
natural disasters—
floods, hurricanes,
cyclones, and national
crises, including nuclear
blast short of a direct
hit.
The cable can take an
overall pressure of more
than 100 pounds a square
inch and will last for
at least 25 years, Harris
said.
All communications
equipment associated
with the cable is stock-
piled in underground
concrete buildings.
The cable runs for 13
miles to California,
skirting all major cities,
and potential targets
throughout the country.
The route is 900 under-
ground miles, with 13
amplifier stations—
all underground.
The cable communications
center, built of heavy
reinforced concrete, are
located above ground
and are protected by
concrete blast walls.
