**Dog Licenses**

**Sale Today**

Frankfort—State dog licenses go on sale July 1. A commission of 5 percent, plus a fee of \$1.00, will be charged for each license.

The \$1.50 sale will be on sale in all of the 120 counties of the state. Dog wardens or sheriffs will be in charge of the sale.

Any person operating a kennel may, in lieu of a license for each dog, apply to the warden for a kennel license. A license fee of \$10 is required to keep dogs or cats; a fee of \$15 is charged to keep more than ten dogs.

In noting the sale of 1965 tags, Butler said the purpose of the law is to eliminate stray dogs and to control rabies. Along with the requirement that dogs be licensed, the State Board of Health requires that all dogs six months old or older be vaccinated for rabies.

Butler pointed out that the license provides identification for the dog, should it be lost or stolen. Too, the tag assures canine treatment so any dog picked up by the warden.

"If a child is bitten by a dog that can be identified and shown to have been vaccinated, chances are he or she will not be compelled to sue the coattail and painful rabies treatment. However, if a child is bitten by a dog that has not been vaccinated, the child's parents will be liable for the cost of the rabies treatment."

The department, through the State Health Department, will reimburse livestock owners who have suffered livestock damages from dogs. However, Butler stated that a dog's master must have a dog found in order to qualify for payment of livestock damages.

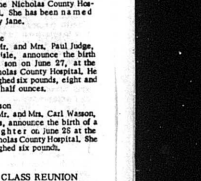
